## Candidate's responsibilities

Candidates have the option of appointing an Agent to act on their behalf under the election funding and financial disclosure provisions of the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918*. Otherwise the candidate is deemed to be his/her own Agent.

Note: an appointed party Agent is **not** deemed to be the Agent of a candidate endorsed by that party — a separate appointment would need to be made by the candidate. Similarly, an Agent appointed for a Senate group is not automatically the Agent of the candidates standing in that group.

To appoint an Agent this form must be lodged by close of nominations. It is recommended that this form be completed and lodged with the nomination form.

## Agent's responsibilities

An Agent assumes responsibility for lodging disclosure returns of election donations and campaign expenditure on behalf of the candidate. The Agent of an unendorsed (independent) candidate is also the person to whom election funding is paid. (Election funding entitlements of endorsed candidates are paid direct to the relevant party.)

A Funding and Disclosure Handbook for Candidates explaining these responsibilities is available from the Australian Electoral Commission (AEC) at the address shown on this form or from the AEC's website [www.aec.gov.au](http://www.aec.gov.au). A copy of the handbook is sent to each Agent upon appointment and each candidate after nomination.

Note: the *Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918* contains penalties for persons who contravene the funding and disclosure provisions.

## Eligibility for appointment

To be eligible for appointment as an Agent a person must:

- be at least 18 years of age; and
- not have been convicted of an offence under the funding and disclosure provisions.

## Appointment of an Agent

To be effective an appointment must use this form, be signed by both the candidate and the nominated Agent and be received by the Australian Electoral Commission by the close of nominations in the State or Territory where the candidate is standing for election. A faxed appointment will be accepted but the original appointment form should also be forwarded.

A person may accept multiple appointments as an Agent but each appointment must be made separately.

## Termination of appointment

An appointment as an Agent for a candidate is only valid for a single election. An appointment can be revoked by the candidate or resigned by the Agent at any time by giving written notice to the Australian Electoral Commission at the address shown on this form.
