TO THE VOTERS OF WILLS

My primary policy is for the abolition of the means test for all social service payments because:

- 1.) The administration cost must be horrendous and absorbs an enormous portion of the revenue raised!
- 2.) People with higher income pay a large part of it back in taxes anyway!
- 3.) Many people would not run down their savings when the pension time approaches!
- 4.) It would encourage the elderly to save because they would not be penalized for their savings!

The means test comprises a grossly unfair tax burden. As a pensioner, if I or my wife earn \$1,000 extra in a year, our pension is immediately reduced by \$500. In addition we pay tax of 20% on the extra \$1,000 plus Medicare levy of 1¼%. This reduces the \$1,000 to a net \$287.50 which is an effective tax rate of 71.25%. This against the tax rate of 48.25% for the highest income earners in the country!

What disgraceful treatment of the elderly who have paid taxes all their lives and their savings have been eroded by taxes, inflation and devaluations!

A wealth levy of 1% above the \$400,000 mark would make up for the loss of revenue involved in abolishing the means test.

For a single person the first \$400,000 would be exempt.

For a married couple the first \$800,000 would be exempt plus \$100,000 for each dependend person.

For example the Prime Minister with 4 children would have the first \$1,200,000 exempt of wealth tax. If one makes the assumption that his net worth is \$2,000,000, his wealth levy would be \$8,000.

To cut distribution costs all pension payments could be made monthly instead of fortnightly.

To pursue the above policy I ask for your votes.

On the question of preferences, I would give my own to John C. Delacretas, not because he is the endorsed candidate for the Liberal Party, but because he is one of the most sincere people it is my fortune to know.
